

Old Testament Power Point presentations

1. These Power Point presentations only give an introduction to the book – i.e. a broad outline, dealing with the main themes and doctrines. They cannot possibly cover all the incidents recorded. The Cross features in every book; this is at the centre of the Christian faith and life.
2. The presentation should always be carefully and prayerfully prepared.
3. Encourage those attending to bring their Bibles with them so that they can look up verses of Scripture. Be prepared to show, both old and young alike, where the verses are.
4. Ensure that you read through the whole of the book, at least once, and familiarise yourself with the context of the book in relation to the rest of the Old and New Testament.
5. Read through the guide notes for the book. The sign ‡ means left click on the mouse ** to lead on to the next slide/animation/image to be displayed on the screen. This is assumed that the mouse setting is used in the right hand. Left hand settings will mean a left click. ‡ to open → means that the click will lead to a new slide. ‡ → **End of slide show (black screen)** means that the click will show the black slide with the wording – “**End of slide show, click to exit.**” This click will return you to the Home page of the Power Point programme.
6. The guide notes include miniature pictures of each slide.
7. Sometimes, a spiritual application is given either in the notes or on screen. Feel free to apply as you wish, as long as it is in accordance with Scripture and does not compromise the overall teaching of the book you are dealing with.
8. After finishing the presentation, make sure to ‘power-down’ the projector before switching it off. If this is not done, the bulb may get damaged!
9. If you think the text on the slides is inaccurate please let me know. Do not attempt to alter animation or other settings, wording or slide layouts etc.. If you have any other comments (or complaints) regarding the presentations please let me know.

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** The slide/animation can also be advanced by pressing the ENTER key or the DOWN arrow on the keyboard. To go backwards, press the UP arrow. If using a ‘wireless presenter’, with a laser pointer, make sure that you practice using it. **NEVER** point a laser beam directly at a person.
