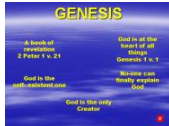

– Genesis ≠ is a book of revelation (2 Peter 1: 21), ≠ God is at the heart of all things (Genesis 1: 1), ≠ God is the self-existent one, ≠ no-one can finally explain God, ≠ God is the only creator. ≠ to open →

Slide 3



– Grey background – before creation ≠ creation in 6 days. **1.** Darkness and light – 1: 3-5; **2.** The firmament – waters divided from above and below – 1: 6-8; **3.** Dry land and seas created, plants created – 1: 9-13; **4.** Sun, moon and stars created – 1:14-19; **5.** Flying creatures, fish created – 1: 20-23; **6.** Animals created, Man & Woman created – 1: 24-31. ≠ to open →

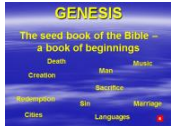
– Day 7 – a day of rest. ≠ The reason for the day – Genesis 1: 3. See also - ≠ References in Exodus 20: 8, Isaiah 58: 13. ≠ to open →

– This is ≠ God's world, created by Him – 1: 31 – God saw that everything... was very good. Note: The world map may have looked different at the time of Genesis. ≠ to open →

– Genesis, ≠ the seed book of the Bible, a book of beginnings. For example ≠ death, life, man, marriage, cities, music etc..(probably more than 80) ≠ to open →

Slide 7



– We look at three ‘seeds’. ≠ **Man Planted By God**. Man was to have dominion, not rise to it (Psalm 8: 6). The development of this seed showed disaster for men. Judgment followed judgment as he persisted in going his own way. ≠ Expelled from Eden (Genesis 3), at the time of the Flood (Genesis 6-9), the Tower of Babel Genesis 11) – confusion of language, Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19). The branching out of this tree into Jew and Gentile (Genesis 12). ≠ to open →

Slide 8



– ≠ **Sin Planted By Satan** leads to ≠ Lies in Eden and Disobedience by Adam and Eve (Genesis 3); Hatred – Cain hated his brother Abel and Murder – Cain murders his brother Abel (Genesis 4); Pride (Genesis 11); Godlessness (Genesis 19); Deceit (Genesis 27); Jealousy (Genesis 37); Envy (Genesis 37) etc.. ≠ to open →

Slide 9



– ≠ **Redemption planted by God**. As soon as sin entered into the world, the antidote was available. ≠ in Eden (Genesis 3:15) – the promise of Salvation, and the provision of clothes of skins of animals which had been killed; Abel’s sacrifice (Genesis 4: 1-15) involved the shedding of blood; the saving of Noah and his family (Genesis 7) from the judgement of the flood; the offering of Isaac, Abraham’s son, but a substitute provided (Genesis 22) ; Joseph, humiliated and exalted to become a Saviour of his people (Genesis 45). ≠ to open →

- Before the world was created Redemption was planned ‡ All this points to Christ's work on the cross. ‡ Redemption planned in eternity. Revelation 13 vs.8 speaks of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world ‡ Redemption's seed developed into the work of Christ on the Cross - Galatians 3:13 – Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law.
