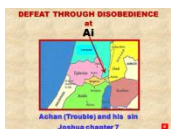
– Joshua ≠ New Leader – Deuteronomy 31: 23, ≠ New Land. Joshua 1 : 1-4. The book has a lot to do with the settlement of the 12 tribes The book could be entitled – “The Way to Victories Christian Living” – Romans 15: 4, 1 Corinthians 10 : 11) ≠ to open →

– Picture of the walls of Jericho [a fortified city] falling down. Briefly tell the story of the capture of the city ≠ Victory through obedience at Jericho. ≠ This is told in Joshua chapter 6. ≠ to open →

– Map of Israel. Defeat through disobedience: Israel’s self-confidence after their victory at Jericho ≠ at Ai + arrow showing position of Ai. ≠ Achan (means= Trouble) and his sin; Joshua chapter 7. The lesson of Achan [victory forfeited] is a fundamental one for Christians to learn. ≠ to open →

– The division of the land. Map of Israel showing the allocation of the 12 tribes. Chapters 13-19. The Levites did not possess a portion of the land; the sons of Joseph – Ephraim and Manasseh – were allocated parts of the land. Manasseh had land on both side of the River Jordan. ≠ 9½ tribes on the West on Jordan and ≠ 2½ on the East. ≠ God appointed 6 Cities of refuge. ≠ Kedesh ≠ Golan ≠ Ramoth ≠ Shechem ≠ Bezer ≠ Hebron. 3 cities on the east of Jordan and 3 cities on the west. Briefly explain the purpose of the cities. ≠ to open →

– The stone of Witness ≠ Picture of a stone – a silent witness of what God had said, and what the people said in response. ≠ chapter 24: 15 – “...choose for yourselves this day.” ≠ The people’s response – “No, but we will serve the LORD” – vs.21. ≠ The people’s response – “The LORD our God we will serve, and His voice we will obey!” – vs.24. ≠ to open →

– Joshua’s testimony to ≠ God’s faithfulness ≠ in crossing the Jordan (3: 10) ≠ in supplying the manna (5: 12) ≠ in giving victory over enemies (5: 13-15) ≠ in establishing refuge cities (20: 7-8) ≠ in all that He said He would do (24: 14) Can we say that God has been faithful to us? – see Lamentations 3: 23. ≠ to open →

– The name JOSHUA in the OT means Salvation (Hebrews 4: 8) ≠ The cross is displayed ≠ This is the same as JESUS in the NT which means Saviour (Matthew 1 v.21) ≠ Joshua’s testimony to God’s faithfulness is guaranteed in the cross – 2 Corinthians 1: 20 ≠ God’s promise of His continual presence. Our Lord’s promise of Matthew 28: 20.

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
