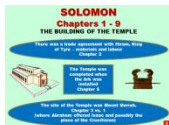

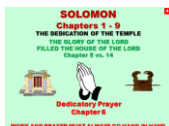
– We will remember that 1 & 2 Chronicles deals primarily with the history of Judah, the Southern Kingdom and looks at events from the Priestly or Church point of view. ‡ to open →

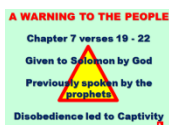
– The first 9 chapters deal with King Solomon, and his ‡ great task of Building the Temple. (See also the notes on the 1st book of Chronicles.) ‡ there was a trade agreement with Hiram, King for Tyre, for materials and labour. Chapter 2. ‡ When the building of the Temple was finished, ‡ then the Ark ‡ was brought in to complete the work – chapter 5. ‡ The site of the Temple was Mount Moriah – chapter 3: 1. This is the place where David built an altar on the threshing floor of Ornan. It is highly likely that this was the place where Abraham offered up his son Isaac. It was also possibly the site of the crucifixion. ‡ to open →

– The building of the temple is followed by ‡ the dedication of the Temple, when ‡ “The Glory of the LORD filled the House of God”, chapter 5: 14. ‡ Chapter 6 records Solomon’s dedicatory prayer. ‡ Note that prayer and work must always go hand in hand. Note God’s acceptance of this House in chapter 7: 12-16. ‡ to open →

– However God has to give a warning to the people. The road sign is that which gives a warning of what is ahead. See ‡ chapter 7: 19-22. ‡ The warning was given by God to Solomon. ‡ Previously spoken by the prophets. ‡ Disobedience would lead to captivity. ‡ to open →

Slide 6



- 2 Kings chapter 17 showed that the Northern Kingdom of Israel was overpowered by the Assyrians under Sennacherib and dispersed among the nations in 722 BC. The Assyrians occupied Israel, together with other nations e.g. the Samaritans. In chapter 36: 15-21, the Southern Kingdom of Judah is taken into captivity to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar (586 BC). The return after 70 years is led by Zerubabel and Ezra. Nehemiah repairs the wall of Jerusalem. The walls of Jerusalem are broken down, and the Temple burnt. to open →

- This map shows Judah and Israel, together with Jerusalem and Babylon. The red dotted line shows the Captivity of Judah to Babylon, and the purple dotted line the dispersion of Israel among the nations. to open →

- The reason for Captivity and Dispersion - Disobedience brought God's judgement. In the garden of Eden, everything was spoiled by disobedience. Genesis chapter 3. However, by one man's Obedience, many will be made righteous. Romans 5: 19.

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
