- Isaiah ‡ the Holy one of Israel (chapter 1: 4). The burden of Isaiah was that God is Holy. ‡ to open →

- Some facts about Isaiah – ‘The Prophet of Holiness’. ‡ The son of Amos, prophesied in the days of Kings Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah. ‡ He prophesied mainly to the southern Kingdom of Judah. ‡ His ministry approx. 775 BC, and lasted about 60 years. ‡ Some of his ministry is seen in 2 Chronicles chapters 26-32, and 2 Kings chapters 19-20. ‡ The Lord Jesus Christ quotes from Isaiah chapters 6, 9, 29, 40, 42, 53, 61. ‡ The name Isaiah means – “The Salvation of Jehovah”. Note: Some people think that the book of Isaiah was written by three writers. But the testimony of the Septuagint, the Jewish teachers and the Dead Sea Scrolls all point to there being just one book and one writer. ‡ to open →

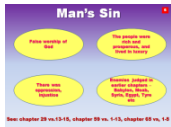
- ‡ Isaiah's three pointed message dealt with ‡ God's Holiness, ‡ man's sin ‡ and the promise of Salvation. ‡ to open →

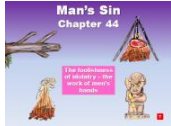
- God's Holiness – Chapter 6. The vision that Isaiah had in the Temple is represented here ‡ by the veil before the Holy of Holies, and the altar of incense. ‡ The unclean lips and their cleansing (v. 5 & 7) ‡ by coals from off the altar. ‡ The word “Holy” is used over 50 times in the book. ‡ to open →

- Man's sin. ‡ False worship of God. ‡ The people were rich and prosperous and lived in luxury ‡ There was oppression and injustice. ‡ Enemies judged in earlier chapters – Babylon, Moab, Syria, Egypt, Tyre etc... ‡ See chapters 29: 13-15; 59: 1-13; 65: 1-5. ‡ to open →

- Man's sin – chapter 44. ‡ Man cut down a tree. ‡ He uses some of it to light a fire on which to cook. ‡ He warms himself by the fire. ‡ He carves an idol out of the rest of the tree. ‡ The foolishness of idolatry. ‡ to open →

- Looking at Isaiah's prophecy about God's people. His foretelling what is yet to happen. ‡ This is looked at as through a telescope. ‡ The promised return of God's people from Captivity in Babylon. Chapter 40: 2; 43: 5; 54: 7. ‡ The promised Saviour. Chapter 7: 14; 9: 6. ‡ Christ's earthly ministry. Chapter 11: 1; 7: 15; 61: 1-2. ‡ Peace that Christ will ultimately bring. Chapter 9: 6-7; 42: 1-4. ‡ to open →

- A King shall reign. ‡ His death on the Cross. ‡ His death is shown in ‡ chapter 53 and His resurrection in ‡ chapter 25: 8, 53: 10-12. This will lead to ‡ His glorious reign. ‡ Wonderful words are recorded - ‡ Chapter 1: 18 etc.
