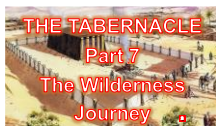

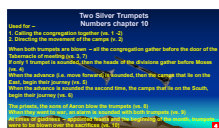
Cloud by day, over the sanctuary (Numbers 9: 16) - ⌘ to open →

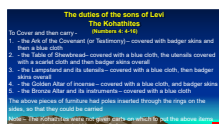
Instructions to make two silver trumpets (Numbers 10: 2). † Picture of the trumpets appear, followed by used for calling the congregation together and directing the movement of the camps. † When both trumpets are blown... † If 1 trumpet is used... † When the advance is sounded... † When the advance is sounded a second time... † The priests blow the trumpet... † When they went to war... † At times of gladness; special occasions. † to open →

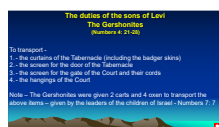
The layout of the camp (Numbers chapter 2). † The Order of the March – as instructed by God to Moses. † The tribes of Issachar, Judah and Zebulun (on the East side of the camp) break camp first, moving Eastward (verse 9), † followed by the tribes of Simeon, Reuben and Gad on the South side of the camp (verse 16), followed by † the Tabernacle and the Levites surrounding it (verse 17). Then † the tribes on the West side of the camp – Manasseh, Ephraim and Benjamin, follow on (verse 24), and lastly, † the tribes of Asher, Dan and Naphtali camping on the North side of the camp (verse 31). † to open →

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The duties of the sons of Levi. † The Kohathites (Numbers 4: 4-16) – to cover and then to carry the Ark of the Covenant, the Table of Shewbread, the Altar of Incense, the Candlestick and the Bronze Altar. † The above pieces of furniture... † the Kohathites were not given carts and Oxen: they were to carry all of these items (Numbers 7:9).

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The duties of the sons of Levi. The Gershonites (Numbers 4: 21-28) – † to transport the curtains, the screens and the hangings of the Tabernacle and the Court. † Note -the Gershonites were given carts and oxen etc. † to open →

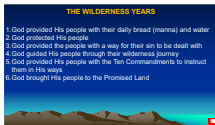
The duties of the sons of Levi. The Merarites (Numbers 4: 29-33) – # to transport the boards of the Tabernacle and the pillars around the court etc. # Note – the Merarites were given carts and oxen. # to open →

The serpent on the pole. # Because of the people's complaint against God and Moses etc. (Numbers 21: 4-9). # The use of Bronze reminds us that sin has to be judged etc See Isaiah 53: 6, John 1: 29 and John 3: 14. This reminds us that all our sin was laid on the Lamb of God, the Lord Jesus Christ. # to open →

The Wilderness years. # In summary, the people of Israel had come through 40 years of travel. God provided, protected, guided and brought His people to the land He had promised. # to open →
