

PAUL THIRD MISSIONARY JOURNEY
c3000 MILES – 3½ YEARS. c AD 53-57
ACTS – 18: 23 – 21: 17

Scripture Reference	Place	What happened
ACTS 18: 23	Antioch	Paul travels through Galatia and Phrygia – “strengthens the disciples” and then comes to →
ACTS 19: 1-41	Ephesus	A ‘second’ Pentecost, disciples baptized – Paul goes into the synagogue and talks about God’s kingdom; people’s hearts are hardened, Paul teaches in the school of Tyrannus (verses 9-10) for 2 years. Many hear about Christ, people are healed (verse 12) – converted magicians burn their books (verse 19). The riot of the silversmiths – the town clerk stops the uproar. Paul departs for →
ACTS 20: 1-2	Macedonia	Paul exhorts the disciples.
ACTS 20:2-3	Greece (? Corinth)	Paul waits there for 3 months; the Jews plot to lay hands on him; he was about to set sail for Syria (verse 3) – but Paul decides to change his plans, and accompanied by friends from different cities, returns via Phillipi to →
ACTS 20: 6-15	Troas	Paul meets with the disciples, and preaches at great length, Eutychus falls asleep, and drops out of a window – he recovers. Paul’s companions sail to Assos. Paul goes on foot and meets the ship at Assos. They then sail to Mitylene (verse 14), Chios and Samos (verse 15) and eventually comes to →
ACTS 20: 15-38	Miletus	Paul sends for the elders of the Church at Ephesus. Paul warns them and comforts them – they accompany him to the ship (Acts 20 :38). He sails to →
ACTS 21: 1	Cos and Rhodes	Then to Patara, and sails to Tyre. Eventually lands at →
ACTS 21: 8	Caesarea	Paul stays with Phillip. Agabus warns of trouble to come in Jerusalem. Paul is determined to continue, and arrives at Jerusalem (Acts 21 :17)
